### RSHE - Spring Term 2

In Spring Term 2, we will focus on Relationships, Sex, and Health Education (RSHE), covering key topics to support children's understanding of relationships, well-being and safety. Please see below the updated PSHE curriculum content:

- Suicide prevention
- Sexual harassment and sexual violence, including stalking
- Loneliness
- The prevalence of 'deepfakes'
- Healthy behaviours during pregnancy, as well as miscarriage and pregnancy loss
- Illegal online behaviours including drug and knife supply
- The dangers of vaping
- Menstrual and gynaecological health including endometriosis, polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS) and heavy menstrual bleeding





### **Oracy Commission**

Oracy is becoming a central focus in education, recognised as the 'fourth R' alongside reading, writing, and arithmetic. The Oracy Commission highlights the importance of developing speaking and listening skills to prepare children for their future and to combat misinformation. We are committed to enhancing oracy in our schools to support children's academic progression and life skills.

### **Governing Body Merger**

From January 2025, our schools will be overseen by a single governing board. This merger will streamline decision-making and ensure a more cohesive approach to governance. A detailed letter will be sent out in January with more information.

### New Catering Provider – Aspens

We are pleased to welcome Aspens from January 2025 as our new catering provider. They will be serving healthy, balanced and delicious meals that support the well-being and energy needs of our children.

### **Early Help Support**

Early Help provides advice and support for families facing challenges, helping to prevent small worries from becoming bigger issues. Support is available for families with children up to 18 years old (or 25 for those with SEND). We can also help with adult concerns, such as finances or mental health, that may impact children.
