Annual Governance Statement for the Local Governing Body of Antingham and Southrepps Primary School and Nursery November 2024

As a school, we focus on high quality teaching and learning which empowers every individual to acquire, demonstrate, articulate and value knowledge and skills so they become well-rounded citizens equipped for the challenges of the 21st century.

The Local Governing Body of Antingham and Southrepps Primary and Nursery has a focus on its three core strategic functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its students, and the performance management of staff;
- 3. Awareness of the financial performance of the school.

Governance arrangements	 The Local Governing Body consists of two Parent Governors, one Staff Governor, five Community Governors and a Trust Director. The Headteacher is also a governor. There are Link Governors for Safeguarding, SEND, Pupil Premium, Finance, Wellbeing, Website and Early Years as well as areas of the curriculum. The Governing Body meets half termly, a total of six meetings a year. Link governors meet with the relevant school staff on a regular basis depending on their link requirements. The Governing Body meets annually for a 'self-evaluation' exercise.

The work that we have done	• Strategic development Transition to the Synergy Trust has enabled the school to benefit from being a member of a larger Trust and from staff and governor training and development. Governors have attended Trust-wide governance training sessions. The Chair of Governors attends termly meetings with other Chairs within the Trust to share best practice.

	Governors have been involved in supporting the Headteacher to
	ensure that the curriculum is cohesive and broad and balanced
	to meet the needs of all children in the school. Governors have
	received presentations from the SENDCo.
•	Educational performance
	Regular reports from the Headteacher enable Governors to
	monitor the educational performance of all children to ensure
	teaching and learning are reaching required standards.
•	Monitoring
	Governors have a termly monitoring programme linked to the
	school's development and improvement plan. Governors have
	met with their departmental links and undertaken monitoring of
	the following areas:

	 Website Early Years

	Reports of visits are shared with the Governing Body. A deep
	dive visit was undertaken by Governors to look at the
	Cornerstones curriculum and Pathways to Write. Lesson
	observations took place across the year groups with English and
	RE a focus. Writing and floor books were looked at. Feedback
	was given to the Headteacher. Points made by Governors were
	reviewed and acted upon.
•	Feedback from children and parents
	Feedback from children was obtained by Governors as part of
	their monitoring visits and through attendance at school events.
	Governors reviewed responses from the parent survey and
	actions were identified. Parent Governors make themselves
	available to listen to the views of parents at parent coffee
	mornings and social events.
•	Safeguarding
	Safeguarding is monitored by the Safeguarding Governor on a
	termly basis and reports presented to the Governing Body at
	each meeting. Staff are well trained and briefed about
	safeguarding matters and that leaders place high importance on
	safeguarding. The Single Central Record is audited annually to
	ensure compliance and a report submitted to the Governing
	Body.
•	Community Links
	Links established with Gresham's Prep School. Visits taking place
	with children attending science, drama and music lessons as
	well as exploring the woodland areas.
•	Parent governors were instrumental in the set-up, marketing
	and launch of the parent toddler group. This well-attended
	group provides a valuable service for the local community.

	 Parent governors are actively involved with Friends events and fundraising for the school. Key issues faced and addressed by the Local Governing Body The annual self-evaluation exercise in October led to actions regarding improvement of communication with stakeholders and increased governor attendance at events.
Future plans for the Local Governing Body	 Continue to strengthen Governors' relationship with the Headteacher, new staff and the Federation. Conduct the annual self-evaluation of the Governing Body and develop an action plan for the coming year, to be monitored on a termly basis Construct a Governor monitoring programme to monitor SIDP priorities. Continue to monitor the embedding of the curriculum. Carry out a deep dive to examine what it is like to be a child at the school Increase governor attendance at events Extend opportunities for Governor training through Synergy Trust and develop links with other Governors within the Trust to share expertise.
