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### What have we been learning?

Henri Matisse Class - The children in Henri Matisse Class, have done a super job with their learning this half term. We have been exploring our topic called 'Once Upon a Time', where we have been reading classic fairy tales like 'Cinderella', 'The Three Little Pigs', 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', 'Little Red Riding Hood', 'Three Billy Goats Gruff' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. They have retold, reenacted, created story maps and 'Wanted!' posters of the Big Bad Wolf, alongside lots of play. We have been doing 'Dough Disco' every morning to strengthen our hands for writing skills and outdoor play to develop our muscles and coordination.

One highlight was when we learned about the wellie boot throwing festival in New Zealand from our 'Pathways to Reading' book called, 'Festivals!'. The children and I decided to hold our own wellie boot 'wangling' contest, where the children all participated in taking turns at throwing their own wellies to see whose could go the farthest!

We continue to go weekly to Bushcraft sessions, where the children have found lots of wiggly worms under logs, a small newt, a frog, noticed changes in the leaves and trees and gathered leaves and seeds to create their own 'Leaf Men' back in class, alongside the story by Lois Elhert.





Georgia O'Keeffe Class - We have been very busy this term at Georgia O'Keeffe's class. In English, we have been travelling through London, learning about its landmarks to create a fact file. In Maths, years 1 and 2 have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes, while Year 3 worked very hard with multiplication and division. We have pushed ourselves artistically, designing sheds in D&T, as well as developing our portrait skills in Art. In Science we are learning about the human body, connecting our learning to PSHE and how to have a healthy body and a healthy mind. Not to mention our deep dive into the festive season. The children have been working hard on our Christmas play, rehearsing every day, singing beautifully. Bring on the Christmas spirit. I would love to take this opportunity to thank all my parents and carers for your care and support during my time in class. I will really miss the children's little faces next year. It has been a joy to get to know them all this year. I wish you all a lovely and restful Christmas holiday.



Takashi Murakami Class - The children in Takashi Murakami class have continued to work well this half term. Our core text in English has been 'Greek Myths' by Jean Menzies. We have enjoyed reading different myths and using these to inspire the children to write their own adventure. We have been continuing to read 'Pig Heart Boy' by Maloire Blackman as our class read. Everyone has been working hard in their maths where we have moved onto looking at multiplication and fractions. In history, we have continued to explore Ancient African Empires and Kingdoms and have been conducting lots of research around this. The learning has taken the children on a journey of the African Slave Trade where they have explored what the slaves would have experienced at this time. Science has been extremly insteresting where we have been looking at heart rate and how exercise can affect this. PE has been lots of fun learning gymnastices and it has been great to see their confidence in the water in swimming. The year 4's had a great afternoon at Gresham Prep where they enjoyed a Design and Technology session making their own keyrings. Finally, the rehearsals for the Christmas production have been in full swing and we cannot wait to show you all their hard work in remembering lines and songs!
